Reception Post Box Walks



Reception Post Box Walks

Rabbits and Moles enjoyed a walk to the local post box this week to post their thank you letters to the doctor, the dental nurse and the firefighters who visited us this term. The children were very excited to be leaving school and going on a short trip and we even saw the postman on our travels.

"You need a stamp."

"Look! There is the postman's van!"

"There is the postbox, it is red!"

"You need letters and numbers on the letter so the postman knows where to send the letter to."

We saw some daffodils and crocus growing in someone's front garden. When we arrived back at school we even saw some snowdrops growing in the Rec.

"The daffodils are growing. They are yellow. What are the purple flowers?"

"The white flowers are called snowdrops."

The walk gave the children a wonderful chance to practise real-life skills, like crossing the road safely. We may have got a bit wet in the rain but we enjoyed singing our favourite songs, talking about our own experiences and spotting the signs of winter and early spring. We definitely got our steps in this week!

Reception Year team



This week, the children took part in **Safer Internet Day**, where we learned how to use the internet in a safe way. Our teaching this year was based around the theme '**Smart tech, safe choices - Exploring the safe and responsible use of AI**'. The children talked about how to stay safe whilst using the internet, asking a grown up for help if something feels wrong and keeping personal information private.

In Reception, the children talked about voice assistants and how we can safely use them.

"I have an Alexa at home and it can play music."

"They are not a real person."

"They can tell you a fact about centipedes."

"Miss Carne put a timer on the iPad without touching any buttons!"

In Year 1, the children created smoothies on Purple Mash and they talked about how they keep their personal information private, for example their log in details.

"You have to log in with your password. You don't share your password with anyone but you can tell your trusted adult like my Mummy."

"You have to remember to log out so no one can use your Purple Mash log in."

In Year 2, the children also talked about voice assistants.

"Voice assistants could tell you a story but it might do a scary one...so you need to say 'tell a story for a 7 year old boy'."

"An Alexa can't throw a ball."

"A voice assistant is like a computer speaker."

It is really important to talk with your children on an ongoing basis about staying safe online and when using technology. Here are a few conversation starters to help:

- Ask your children to tell you about the sites they like to visit and what they enjoy doing online or when using technology.
- Ask them about how they stay safe online or when using technology.
- Ask them if they know where to go for help, when at home or at school.
