

Get them to choose a book (or two) to read with you on the sofa or in bed at the end of each day. Encourage them to tell you why they've selected the book, and what they like and dislike about it." (https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/grownups/making-time-for-books-at-home)

This week, as a family, listen to a book (read aloud by you or as an audio book) from genres that they/you don't usually read.

You choose first from a genre they don't usually read.

If possible, do this somewhere with minimal distractions!

Afterwards discuss what they/you

Afterwards, discuss what they/you liked/didn't like and why.
