## Multi Academy Trust (MAT)

You may be aware, that still high on the government's agenda is the move for all schools, to a MAT (Multi Academy Trust), from the Local Authority. When governors and I attended the West Sussex MAT exhibition last month, the Regional Director from the DfE confirmed this.

As a result, the governors are currently exploring options for our school. We are also revisiting our non-negotiables for moving to a MAT, so that we remain confident that we are putting the needs of our children, staff and community at the heart of our decisions. The governors will write with further information in due course.

#### Did you know....?

"Language develops through interaction with others. Inevitably, by the time they start school, some children understand more and know more words than others, because of the quantity and quality of the interactions they have already had with adults and others. Children who begin school with a poor understanding of language will need considerable support to develop their spoken language."

Challenge(s) of the week...

- Make a 'story sack' at home, based on a favourite story or a story you have just read! Can your child make/draw/find things that they could use to bring that story 'to life'?
- Discuss the key parts of the story can you make a 'story map' to go with your story sack? A story map is a series of pictures and simple words with arrows between them. You can use the 'map' to retell the story. (Example below, for the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk'!)
