



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
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Limit the time you spend on technology.

Apps written for young children are normally easier to use than those made for older children or grown-ups. Grown-ups use apps to do things like shopping or looking up the weather.

Our Online / Offline Behaviour

It can be quite tricky making good choices and decisions.

In an online environment this is even more important as the person / audience can't judge your tone of voice / see the expression on your face



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The SMART Rules

SAFE:



Keep your personal information safe. When chatting or posting online don't give away things like your full name, password or home address. Remember personal information can be seen in images and videos you share too. Keep them safe to keep yourself safe.



MEET:

Meeting up with someone you only know online, even a friend of a friend, can be dangerous as this person is still a stranger. If someone you only know online ever asks you to meet up, for personal information or for photos/videos of you then tell an adult straight away and report them together on www.thinkuknow.co.uk



ACCEPTING:

Think carefully before you click on or open something online (e.g. links, adverts, friend requests, photos) as you never know where they may lead to or they may contain viruses. Do not accept something if you are unsure of who the person is or what they've sent you.



RELIABLE:

TELL:

You cannot trust everything you see online as some things can be out of date, inaccurate or not entirely true. To find reliable information compare at least three different websites, check in books and talk to someone about what you have found.



Tell a trusted adult if something or someone ever makes you feel upset, worried or confused. This could be if you or someone you know is being bullied online.
