Reception Year - Woodland Time

Rabbits and Moles enjoyed their Woodland Time sessions over the last two weeks. We read the book 'A Superhero Like You' and talked about our own super powers. We created Superhero potions in the mud kitchen using our **Super Imagination**, built a den for the Superheroes using our **Super Strength**, searched for natural objects and matched them to the initial phoneme using our **Super Phonics Knowledge** and we ended our afternoon with a healthy outdoor snack.

It was fantastic to see all the children engaging in the different activities on offer and enjoying being outside in the fresh air. The muddy faces said it all!

"When children start learning to read, the number of words they can decode accurately is too limited to broaden their vocabulary. Their understanding of language should therefore be developed through their listening and speaking, while they are taught to decode through phonics."

Play the 'word ladder' game with your child this week!

You/they write down a word, then you take it in turns to change one letter each time it's your turn. You decide if the word has to be a real word, or if it just has to be a word they can say (e.g. fap).

How many different words can you make, changing only one letter every time?

e.g.

cat, hat, ham, ram, rag, rug, mug, mum, hum

line, fine, five, live, like, lake, tape, cape, cake
