

# **Pupil Premium Funding**

You may be aware that the Government allocates additional funding to schools in the form of the 'Pupil Premium Grant'. In order to be eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant a parent or carer must be receiving one of the following benefits:

- Income Support.
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance.
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance.
- Support from National Asylum Support Service (NASS) under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit.
- Child Tax Credit only, provided your annual household income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) does not exceed £16,190. Anyone entitled to Working Tax Credit is not entitled to free meals regardless of income.
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you **stop qualifying** for Working Tax Credit).
- Universal Credit (with no element of Working Tax Credit).

If you qualify for this allowance your child will be eligible for the following additional benefits here at Trafalgar -

- No charge for school trips and visitors to school.
- No charge for before or after school club (one a term).
- No charge for a complete set of school uniform to include a sweatshirt or cardigan; PE kit (including t-shirt, shorts and gym bag) and a book bag.

We also use the Pupil Premium Grant to fund a wide range of additional support in school. This may involve either small group work or one-to-one tuition and is one aspect of our drive to continually raise standards. The Pupil Premium Grant can be used to support children regardless of their ability. If you claim this funding, then we can allocate Pupil Premium Funding to provide additional opportunities and challenges for your child with the aim of enriching their educational experience at school in ways that best meet their individual needs.

Even if your circumstances change, and you are no longer receiving one of the benefits listed, your child's school continues to receive additional funding. No one will know you have registered and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming.

## Lost Property & Labelling



The blue lost property 'bin' is located outside the main Reception front door for ease of access. Anything left in it that is not clearly named will periodically be sent for recycling. There are often some very good quality items in lost property and you are urged to seek out your lost goods. The habit will also help the children begin to learn the value of taking care of possessions and not always replenishing old with new! The 'bin' is always available outside the School Office should you want to come in and reclaim your property.

A reminder too of the importance of labelling your child's school clothes - particularly coats and jumpers. We have many unnamed items in our Lost Property 'bin' and they are all recycled on a regular basis. However, clearly labelled clothes can be returned to the relevant owner easily and without upset for you and your child. Your assistance would be greatly appreciated. It is really important that bikes, scooters and safety helmets are clearly named too. We thank you for your assistance.

**Tesco** are running trial collections of broken, hard plastic toys for recycling in <u>selected</u> <u>Tesco stores</u> in East and West Sussex between the 4 Sept 2023 and 4 Dec 2023, and are inviting schools with pupils aged 2 to 11 years of age in these areas to take part.

If any recycled items are registered to our school, then our school gets points on the scheme's 'School Leaderboard'. If the school 'ranks' in the top 50 of schools at the end, we'd get some book vouchers (worth more the higher up the board we 'rank'). No matter where in East or West Sussex, you can log your donated recycled toys to our school to get us points, so any and all relatives/friends' donations count so long as they register the donation to us. Every school that gets at least one donation (even if we're not in the top 50 schools) gets a code for a discount on books from their catalogue.
