

Here at Trafalgar Community Infant school, we are very proud to be offering a wide range of PESSPA (Physical Education, School Sport and Physical Activity) to all children and make sure we adhere to gov.uk and their expectations of Pupil Premium funding.

Below is a table of what the Sport Premium Funding is going to be spent on and what impact this will have.

Key achievements to date until July 2024:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
 PE is being taught across school by all staff – every class is participating in 2x PE sessions weekly. Before and after school clubs offered over the course of the year, in different sporting/physical activity areas. Children have had the opportunity to participate in sporting events at external schools. The daily mile has been successful with classes going out on the track each day to run. Continue to raise the profile of PE at Trafalgar with improved parent communication; on newsletters and social media. External coaches delivering high level PE and upskilling teachers. A successful deep dive from Ofsted. A PP, SEN, vulnerable children register was set up, so they have the opportunity to participate in external evets. Sporting areas at lunchtime have been set up for children to access. A range of sports are available on a weekly basis. Lots of new equipment has replaced old and outdated equipment; providing children with lots of new opportunities. The separation of PE equipment and playtime equipment has meant longer lasting equipment for PE lessons. PE Interventions for vulnerable children during school time, allowing them to be taught in smaller groups twice a week. Feedback from these interventions has given teachers a better understanding of assessment. Embedded the new Twinkl PE scheme and shared with WS School Improvement Advisers. Linking PE with English and Maths through 'Teach Active'. Staff questionnaire was sent out to understand more about the staff's relationship with PE. 	 Clear assessment throughout the school.
