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Do you have subtitles on when you watch films/telly?

Turning on the subtitles while children are watching television can double the chances of them becoming good at reading. Yes, really!

You can turn on subtitles on live television, on streaming services, on YouTube, and, of course, on DVDs!

It's simple to do, just Google it if you're unsure how to on your device.

10 seconds to do it, and lifetime's impact for your children. All backed up by decades of scientific research.

One academic study of 2,350 children found that 34% became good readers with schooling alone, but, when exposed to 30 minutes a week of subtitled film songs, that proportion more than doubled to 70%! The studies also found that most children *didn't notice* they were absorbing the words of the subtitles, but were *benefitting* from them being on *anyway*!

So, let's turn those subtitles on!

Talk with your child about the differences between fiction, non-fiction, chapter books, picture books, and poetry. Are they ever more than one thing? Can they find an example of each? What else might you read (e.g. adverts, leaflets, top trump cards, cereal boxes)? What do they like reading most? Why?

Can they make a poster (or posters!) for the school library to explain to others about the many different types of things that you can read?
