### School Council News

Some of our School Council members met with Miss Hickie this week, and fed back what they feel is working really well in school at the moment. It was positive to hear that they are enjoying the range of lunch break activities which are on offer each day. They also commented "that all of the adults are kind to us" and we are really proud of how well they are all engaging with the activities at lunch time too.

Activities during lunch break include role play (dressing up), small world play (dolls houses, cars and garage), mini theatre, construction kits (builders, painters), team sporting games (non-contact e.g. tag rugby, basketball, football), individual/paired sporting activities (e.g. hurdles, hop scotch, skipping, bean bags, hoops), indoor lunch club (playdough, fine motor activities, calming music for reflection), lego, reading music shed, pirate ship, resources, dinosaurs, and 'craze of the week' which comes out for the last 15 minutes of each lunch break, and changes most weeks (e.g. paint brushes and water for mark making, boat toys, pompoms). All children can access all activities every day, and it is wonderful to see children try different things with different friends.

The School Council are also liaising with their class, and redesigning the central pond area, which is now larger, as we have removed the dividing fence. Ideas for this area so far include mini beast/bug/animal areas, science activities, using it for art lessons and as a playtime club venue.

## CoolMilk - Over 5s - Please Register for Milk



A reminder that once your child turns 5 years old, they will no longer be eligible for the free milk for under-5s scheme.

However, if you would like your child to continue having milk delivered to school daily, once they have turned 5 years old, for a subsidised cost, you can register your child with CoolMilk direct via their website www.coolmilk.com or by telephone to 0800 321 3248.

Once you have registered your child, CoolMilk will let us know and their name will be added to the classroom list. Please note this does take a few days to process so the sooner you register them, the sooner they will start having milk again.

## Sussex Greener Living - Repair and Rewild Roadshow



Sussex Greener Living - Repair and Rewild Roadshow. What a wonderful opportunity to support our ecology curriculum!

Carrie Court and Morag Warrack from Sussex Greener Living are coming into Trafalgar School on Monday, 22<sup>nd</sup> May to support our ecology learning. They will be here all day with a range of activities.

- There will be the Sussex Greener Living ECO Float on the playground at drop-off AND
  pick up times for parents and carers to engage with Sussex Greener Living and find out
  more about its valuable work. Please stop and chat with them and pick up a leaflet!
- There is a whole school assembly at 9.10am focusing on The Repair Cafe/ Sussex Green Hub - teaching children about the importance of fixing broken toys, bikes and repairing clothes rather than just always throwing away and buying new.
- There will be workshops with each Year 1 class: spending time exploring the ECO Float looking at the eco garden and landscape- what can they see, introduction to composting, importance of growing food for humans and wildlife.
- and then Year 1 will be rewilding the raised beds behind the huts as a meadow, beefriendly, sensory herb area. and looking at how the surrounding areas can be enhanced for wildlife. The sessions will be as interactive and as 'hands- on' as possible.
- The school used to host a TerraCycle drop off and Miss Green has agreed to restart a drop off with bins open to the public by our textile bank. Sussex Green Living recycling team will help to set this up. A school volunteer will need to manage this, training and set up support will be provided by Sussex Greener Living.
- Year 1 have already begun weeding the beds to be used before Sussex Greener Living's visit as part of their science curriculum/learning.

To support this ECO project, we are asking for donations from parents and carers of any suitable plants from your own garden, as healthy cuttings, so we can begin the planting up and rewilding of the flower beds around school.

<u>Suitable plants:</u> any robust herb plants would be wonderful- rosemary, marjoram, lovage, thyme or even resilient food plants like rhubarb or currants or gooseberries would be great.

Also, if you have any bee-friendly plants for pollinators that would be great:

<u>Spring flowering:</u> Buddleia are great for adult butterflies as are early season: Aubretia, Bluebell, Clover, Cuckooflower, Daisy, Forget-me-not, Honesty, Pansy, Primrose, Sweet Rocket and Wallflower.

<u>Late Summer/ Autumn flowering:</u> French Marigold, Michaelmas Daisy.

We are also asking for a volunteer to support the school and Sussex Greener Living by volunteering to manage the TerraCycle. Training and set up support will be provided by Sussex Greener Living.

We greatly appreciate your support in developing this aspect of the school curriculum and the school grounds. If anyone is able to pop in and help maintain these areas in the future, at a time that suits you, please contact the school office.
