Healthy Snacks/No Nuts



Please can we remind parents/carers to provide their child with a healthy fruit or vegetable snack to bring to school eat day e.g. an apple, banana, carrots, cucumber, tomato, bread sticks, rice cakes. Staff Car Park



A friendly reminder that the staff car park is only to be used by parents/carers for drop off/collection in exceptional circumstances, and **only if agreed in advance by the Headteacher, Miss Hickie**. It is really important that we have spaces available for our staff and visitors to the school, hence please only park in there if you have permission and **please do not park in the Disabled Bays unless you have a valid Blue Badge**, which should be on display.

Please may we also ask that the staff car park entrance is kept clear at all times as it is in constant use as staff arrive and leave, and supervise your child crossing the car park entrance carefully. We do need to keep the car park barrier up to allow access for people who are coming to use or donate to our community Foodbank. Thank you for your co-operation.

Safety on the Roads at Drop-off and Pick-up



We have been asked by members of Horsham Trafalgar Neighbourhood Council to inform you of concerns about the number of cars that are parked irresponsibly by adults collecting and dropping off children on the streets adjacent to our school. In addition to the fact that these cause safety worries for pedestrians (including children attending our school) and other drivers, there is the concern that some of these people also leave their car engines running.

Idling, instead of turning your engine off while stationary, increases the amount of exhaust emissions in the air. These emissions contain a number of harmful gasses including carbon dioxide, which is bad for the environment and contributes towards climate change, as well as a range of other harmful gasses including nitrogen dioxide, carbon monoxide and hydrocarbons which are linked to asthma and other lung diseases.

Please can we urge you all to turn your engines off whilst parked safely and considerately, at all times, not only to keep our community safe, but also to show courtesy to our neighbours. We appeal to you all to think seriously about the potential consequences of awkward or obstructive parking in the roads/on corners leading to the school and for our neighbouring houses.

Finally, please may we remind parents/carers to let children out of their cars onto the **pavement** when arriving at school each day. The roads outside school are incredibly busy at these times and children are at greater risk getting out of vehicles on to the busy road.

Whilst we appreciate that traffic, parking and dropping off and collecting from school can be a frustrating affair your co-operation and consideration is greatly appreciated.
