Attendance Figures and Arriving at School on Time



A polite reminder please, that children arrive to school on time, so that they have a smooth and calm start to their day.

The school day starts at 8.50am with activities starting from this moment on, even before the register has been taken. It is very disruptive for the class if children arrive late. It is also important that the children do not miss these vital learning opportunities!

Did you know that we have our pupil attendance and lateness figures checked by the Local Authority and the DFE (Department for Education) and that any children who regularly arrive late/are absent are identified and actions then have to be implemented to improve their attendance and punctuality? If your child is even 5 minutes late, this equates to 25 minutes learning time being missed each week, which has a huge impact on your child's progress and attainment. The children get to work first thing, so please do ensure that they arrive on time, and come to school each day!

Please help the children maximise their learning by getting them into school on time and please do not remove your child from school unless it is really necessary and remember to complete the Leave from Learning request form (available from the School Office) if you do need to request absence.

The National expectation for each child's attendance is 96% or better. We are currently at a Whole School attendance figure of 94.73%. Therefore, it is in the best interest of the whole school if all parents/carers try to ensure that their own child/ren's attendance figure remains healthy, so that learning is maximised!

Pupil Premium Funding

You may be aware that the Government allocates additional funding to schools in the form of the 'Pupil Premium Grant'. In order to be eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant a parent or carer must be receiving one of the following benefits:

- Income Support.
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance.
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance.
- Support from National Asylum Support Service (NASS) under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit.
- Child Tax Credit only, provided your annual household income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) does not exceed £16,190. Anyone entitled to Working Tax Credit is not entitled to free meals regardless of income.
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you **stop qualifying** for Working Tax Credit).
- Universal Credit (with no element of Working Tax Credit).

If you qualify for this allowance your child will be eligible for the following additional benefits here at Trafalgar -

- No charge for school trips and visitors to school.
- No charge for before or after school club (one a term).
- No charge for a complete set of school uniform to include a sweatshirt or cardigan; PE kit (including t-shirt, shorts and gym bag) and a book bag.

We also use the Pupil Premium Grant to fund a wide range of additional support in school. This may involve either small group work or one-to-one tuition and is one aspect of our drive to continually raise standards. The Pupil Premium Grant can be used to support children regardless of their ability. If you claim this funding, then we can allocate Pupil Premium Funding to provide additional opportunities and challenges for your child with the aim of enriching their educational experience at school in ways that best meet their individual needs.

Even if your circumstances change, and you are no longer receiving one of the benefits listed, your child's school continues to receive additional funding. No one will know you have registered and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming.
