



Voluntary One Way System

The school is grateful to parents/carers who are prepared to use the voluntary 'one way' system. For the safety of the children as well as for the convenience of all, we hope everyone will comply. As a reminder, when travelling to the school by car, leave Rushams Road by way of Percy Road, Shelley Road or Greenway and approach the school along Spencers Road; and when leaving the school rejoin Rushams Road by way of Victory Road. This is a considerable help in easing the congestion in the roads surrounding the school at peak times, and improve helps to safety, when parents/carers are delivering collecting their children.

Medication in School and Keeping Warm as Winter Approaches









Now the Winter months are fast approaching, germs can increase and illnesses spread. Please be vigilant with your child and encourage hand hygiene, wiping of noses with a tissue and coughing into their elbow.

If your child does need to take medication from the doctors we can administer this at school if the frequency is 4 times a day. If the medication is due 3 times a day we ask this is done before school, straight after school and before bed.

In the cold weather please make sure your children have a warm coat, hats and gloves available to them in school.
